

Curbside Recycling

We are all concerned about the proliferation of waste. Recycling can help. Weekly curbside recycling is the most convenient way to take part in this recycling effort. Everyone is encouraged to join in to help their county reach its state mandated recycling goal, to stem the spiraling costs of disposal, to slow the drain on our natural resources, to reduce pollution and energy consumption, and to put a hold on our mounting garbage problem. Infinity Recycling, Inc.

Infinity Recycling, Inc., is a local non-profit organization that was started in 1989, to provide recycling service to our communities on the Mid-shore. Just as the whole country was feeling the pressure of the trash crisis, the counties of the Eastern Shore faced the problems and expense of their landfills filling up and closing. Infinity Recycling was founded to promote recycling, the sensible alternative to landfills and incineration.

Your Recycling Schedule

Infinity Recycling will pick up your recyclables every **FRIDAY** at about the same time. In the event of a major holiday or really bad weather (snow storm, hurricane), we will skip that week. Waste Reduction

Before you even start to recycle, you can do a few things to reduce your waste. First, learn to **PRECYCLE**. That is, think about the waste you are going to create **before** you buy a product. Is it overpackaged? Is the packing recycled or recyclable? Could you buy a similar object made of recycled material? Second, **REUSE**. This goes for packaging as well as the things that come in it. Third, **COMPOST**. One third of the trash that goes to landfills is yard waste. With a little planning and work, all those leaves, grass clippings and weeds could become fertilizer for next year's garden. Information on composting is available from your county, the University of Maryland Extension Service, or from Infinity Recycling. Feel free to call.

What is Dual Stream?

Dual Stream recycling is the separation of recyclable containers (glass bottles & jars, plastic bottles and metal cans) from fiber (paper, cardboard, clothing). This practice keeps wet & breakable containers away from fiber & paper which should be dry.

How to use receptacles

You will need 2 receptacles for your recycling. We will provide one for your use while you have our service. One for containers, which includes glass bottles & jars, aluminum and tin cans and plastic bottles & jars. One for dry fibers, which includes newspaper, magazines, catalogues, phone books, paper bags, stationary, envelopes & chipboard such as cereal boxes. Clean dry clothing (NO pillows, blankets or rugs) may be placed alongside or on top of the receptacles, tied tightly in plastic bags to avoid moisture. Also if you are recycling shredded paper, please secure it in a bag to minimize it's litter potential. Small electronics (phones, radios, computers) can be recycled with Infinity as well. NO monitors, TV's or appliances.
