Mayor Wilmer presented proposed budget for 1942 showing a suggested reduction in the tax rate of five cents. After reviewing same Mr. Wheatley made a motion that same be accepted, which motion was seconded by Mr. Rogers and carried. Copy of budget attached.

Proposition to increase salaries discussed. Motion was made by Mr. Hadaway that the two Teamsters be granted saturday afternoon off provided they agreed to work if necessary in emergencies without pay, motion seconded by Dr. Moyer and carried.
