

March 2, 1942.

The Mayor and Council met in regular session with all members present as follows: Mayor Wilmer, Councilmen Rogers, Wheatley, Hadaway and Moyer.

Minutes of the February meeting were read and approved, also the financial statement.

Mayor Wilmer welcomed Miss Riches and eleven students of the graduating class in History.

Mr. W. C. Hollinger spoke to the Council in reference to enforcement of an ordinance prohibiting use of any other than fire proof material for repairs or replacement of roofs within the Town limits. He particularly called attention to the fact the government had priorities on all metals and cork used in fire proof roof materials and that he along with other contractors and builders felt it more of a fire hazard to let an old wooden shingle roof stand un-repaired than to repair it with new wooden shingles. He suggested that the enforcement of the ordinance be suspended for the duration or until some other fire resistant material could be obtained. After due consideration motion was made by Mr. Rogers that in compliance with request the enforcement of Ordinance No. 24 be suspended for the duration or until some other fire resistant material could be obtained. Motion was seconded by Mr. Hadaway and carried.

Deferred business: Comfort Station, letters and a petition signed by thirty seven citizens objecting to the location proposed were read. Mr. Rogers made a motion that proposition be tabled for further consideration and in the mean time Mr. Moyer

April 6, 1942.

The Mayor and Council met in regular session with all members present as follows: Mayor Wilmer, Councilmen Rogers, Wheatley, Hadaway and Moyer.

Minutes of the March meeting were read and approved, also Clerk's financial statement.

Mr. W. L. Fowler, President and other members of the Water Board were present. Mr. Fowler in reference to the new ariation and filteration plant which had been installed by the Water Board and requested financial aid to finish paying for the work which amounted to more than had been estimated. Council to consider same.

Mr. Marion deK. Smith appeared before the board for the opening of bids for proposed sewer main on Court Street. There was only one bid received and due to question of levels and suggestion of connection Mr. Smith suggested same be deferred for further investigation. Motion that Court Street proposed sewer be deferred made by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Wheatley and carried.

Mr. R. Clarke Davis, President of the Pipe Company and three others requested the Council to advance the company some money due to the fact they had to purchase new hose. After discussion motion that they be advanced \$500.00 on the annual lap-
